



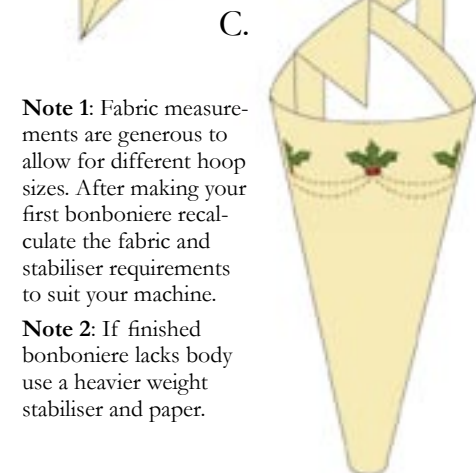
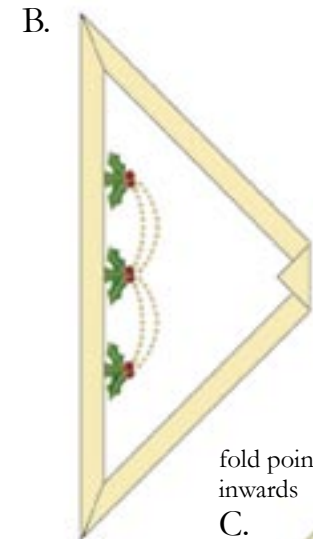
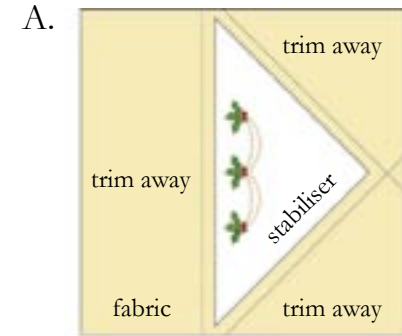
Materials Required

- 'Holly s3 b2' or 'Bow sml' files from Rowena Charlton Designs Christmas Jewels CD
- 33 x 33cm (13 x 13") medium weight cut-away stabiliser
- 33 x 33cm (13 x 13") decorative fabric
- Thread - leaf green (Holly - Col 1), berry red (Col 2), Kingstar metallic gold (Col 3), cream (Bow - Col 1), Kingstar metallic gold (Col 2)
- Spray or stick glue and PVA glue
- 21 x 21cm (8¼ x 8¼") heavy-weight (250gsm) decorative paper
- Matching ribbon 2 pieces 15cm (6") long, for

Construction

1. Centre the hoop on fabric and stabiliser.
2. Stitch out a design, remove the hoop, and press.
3. Working from the back, measure up 1-2 cm (3/8 - 3/4") from the top of the embroidery and mark a straight line on the stabiliser.
4. From a scrap piece of paper cut a 21cm (8¼") square. Fold the square in half diagonally to form a triangle. Making sure the embroidery is centred underneath, place the long edge of the paper triangle against the line marked on the stabiliser.
5. Trace around the paper triangle. Cut along this line and trim away excess stabiliser.
6. Leaving a 1.5 cm (5/8") border around the stabiliser, trim away excess fabric. (Pic. A)
7. Fold the fabric border over the stabiliser, and secure with spray or stick glue. (Pic. B)
8. Fold up the bottom point about 1.5cm (5/8"). (Pic. B)
9. Roll triangle into a cone shape, and secure overlap using PVA glue. Fold points inwards and secure with glue. (Pic. C)
10. For the ribbon hanger, pierce two holes on either side of the cone. Insert ribbon, securing each end with a knot. Tie a bow to complete.
11. Cut the paper to the same size triangle as the stabiliser. Pink the long edge with decorative scissors if desired.
12. Roll the paper into a similar sized cone. Fold the points outwards. Apply a few dabs of stick glue to the outside of the paper cone, and insert it into the fabric cone.
13. Fill with Christmas treats and hang on the Christmas tree. Add a tiny gift tag inscribed with a child's name and watch the recipient's

Note 1: Fabric measurements are generous to allow for different hoop sizes. After making your first bonboniere recalculate the fabric and stabiliser requirements to suit your machine.

Note 2: If finished bonboniere lacks body use a heavier weight stabiliser and paper.
